Mandatory Exclusion

42 U.S.C. § 1320a-7(a)

- 1. Conviction of program-related crimes
- 2. Conviction relating to patient abuse
- 3. Felony conviction relating to health care fraud
- 4. Felony conviction relating to controlled substance

Permissive Exclusion

42 U.S.C. § 1320a-7(b)

- 1. Conviction relating to fraud
- 2. Conviction relating to obstruction of an investigation or audit
- 3. Misdemeanor conviction relating to controlled substance
- 4. License revocation or suspension
